### Update on COVID Guidelines

I would like to thank all our parents who have taken a sensible and cautious approach with regards to Covid. I know only too well from my own children how difficult it can be trying to arrange childcare at the last minute when a child is suddenly unwell. The Chief Medical Officer has once again reiterated the importance of contacting your GP if your child develops symptoms, not to attend school and not to rely on Antigen tests. (These are only recommended as an extra safety measure for people not presenting with symptoms). There has been a lot of new guidance lately so I've done my best to summarise it below.

# Latest Covid Guidelines

## Facemasks

With very short notice the Department of Education has notified schools that it will be compulsory for children in 3<sup>rd</sup> class and upwards to wear face masks in school unless they have a medical exemption. I am awaiting further clarity from the Department on this and there will be a degree of flexibility for the rest of this week. I will keep you posted once I learn more. The majority of children wore their masks today and we were able to supply a mask for anyone who forgot.

## Antigen Tests

Last week the Department announced the introduction of Antigen Tests for primary school children. If a child tests positive for Covid, their parent should contact the school principal. The principal in turn contacts the families of those children sitting close to the child in question. (At no point will the child in question be identified by the principal.) Parents will then be given the option to order a free Antigen Test Kit. Children may still come to school if they are symptom free and have a negative Antigen Test. ## Further Guidelines

Dr Tony Holohan has also suggested that children should avoid doing the following over the next two weeks:

- Indoor birthday parties and play dates – these should take place outdoors and should be kept small
- Sleepovers
- Indoor community gatherings involving children including communions, confirmations, nativity and other seasonal events

If you are arranging a birthday party or a play date, this should be with a maximum of one other household and should take place outdoors. No one with symptoms should attend these events.

Children with any symptoms of COVID-19 should not go to creche or school. They should stay at home and parents should arrange a PCR test as soon as you can.

## Christmas Play


