Climate Action Summer Works




Fantastic News for Our School!

We are delighted to share some wonderful news with you. Our school has been awarded a substantial grant of €300,883 under the Climate Action Summer Works Scheme. This funding will enable us to make significant improvements to our school building, helping create a warmer, greener and more visually appealing environment for our pupils, staff and wider school community.

The primary use of this grant will be to wrap the entire building with high-quality insulation, greatly improving energy efficiency and comfort throughout the year. We also hope to replace the windows and doors, depending on final project costs. As with all capital works, the full process will follow the required tendering and approval procedures, and we will keep you updated as plans develop.

This is a very exciting opportunity for our school, and we are thrilled to be moving forward with upgrades that will benefit current pupils and future generations. We look forward to sharing progress with you as the project unfolds.

Our involvement in the Aspire Project continues to be a great success and a very positive experience for everyone in our school community. We have been fortunate to work in partnership with Gaelscoil na gCeithre Maistí in Donegal Town, and to date, every child in the school has had the opportunity to visit their campus, while their pupils have also spent time with us here. This exchange has been a wonderful way for pupils to mix, communicate and form new friendships, helping build confidence, cooperation and connection between both schools.

One of the most enriching aspects of the project has been our increased exposure to the Irish language. Through shared lessons, activities and conversation, pupils are hearing and using Gaeilge in a more natural and enjoyable way, deepening their understanding and helping it become part of everyday school life.

The Aspire Project has also provided us with the chance to invest in high-quality resources that would otherwise be out of reach due to cost. We are delighted to now have access to Izak9 cubes, STEAM boxes and other innovative teaching materials which are already enhancing learning across the school and opening doors to exciting, hands-on problem-solving experiences.

We look forward to continuing this partnership, nurturing new friendships and building on the wonderful progress already made. The enthusiasm shown by pupils on both sides has been fantastic—and we are excited for what comes next.
